

Ohio District Scholarship Fund

To All Ohio District Optimist Members:

Several times I have been asked, "Why do I continue to ask for donations to the Ohio District Scholarship Fund, when there is so much scholarship money shown in the budget?"

There are many past winners who have not yet claimed the District Scholarship supplements. These past winners have until they reach the age of 25 to enroll in a continuing education program and claim this money. This is the restricted money shown in the budget.

The Ohio District has pledged to supplement the Optimist International Foundation Scholarships for the Oratorical, Essay and CCDHH contests, with an additional \$1000 for each winner and \$100 for each District Oratorical and CCDHH runner-ups each year.

This means that we must raise \$4,600 each year in order to meet this commitment.

The query: Dear Tech Support,

Last year I upgraded from Boyfriend 5.0 to Husband 1.0 and noticed a distinct slowdown in overall system performance, particularly in the flower and jewellery applications, which operated flawlessly under Boyfriend 5.0.

In addition, Husband 1.0 uninstalled many other valuable programs, such as Romance 9.5 and Personal Attention 6.5, and then installed undesirable programs such as: Cricket 5.0, Rugby League 3.0 and Golf Clubs 4.1.

Conversation 8.0 no longer runs and House cleaning 2.6 simply crashes the system. Please note that I have tried running Nagging 5.3 to fix these problems, but to no avail. What can I do? Signed, Desperate.

The response that came weeks later out of the blue:

Dear Desperate,

First keep in mind, Boyfriend 5.0 is an Entertainment Package, while Husband 1.0 is an operating system.

Please enter command: I thought you loved me.html and try to download Tears 6.2. Do not forget to install the Guilt 3.0 update. If that application works as designed, Husband 1.0 should then automatically run the applications Jewellery 2.0 and Flowers 3.5.

However, remember, overuse of the above application can cause Husband 1.0 to default to Grumpy Silence Whatever you do, DO NOT, under any circumstances, install Mother-In-Law 1.0 as it runs a virus in the background that will eventually seize control of all your system resources.

NEW CLUB BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

The report of the New Club Building Committee was presented to the Board of Directors by Jim Boyd for Committee Chair Jim Oliver

Club Within A Club

Rationale:

The Committee is endorsing an initiative to promote the development of a "Club Within a Club" modeled after the successful young professional's club that is a part of the Lake Lotawanna Optimist Club in the West Missouri District.

Many long standing Clubs have difficulty in attracting younger members. Work force changes have made it difficult for some potential members to attend traditional breakfast or lunch style Club meetings. Social and cultural changes, episodic volunteering and mission/project driven focus presents new opportunities that may be addressed in creative meeting and operational style. The **Social Club or Club Within a Club** would meet once or twice a month in a more social setting in early evenings, with a focus on networking and social gathering. The young professionals group provides a traditional Club with an increased volunteer work force to tackle more complex project. It also will provide a platform for younger professionals to join an Optimist Club for their goals of networking, social activity with the availability of volunteering for activities of interest and impact in the Community.

New Club Building credit would be given to any existing Optimist Club that adds 15 members for the Club Within a Club. Two Builders of Excellence designations would also be granted. The Secretary-Treasurer of the host Club must submit a roster of at least 15 members for the group to be recognized and it is recommended the new group have representation on the existing Club's Board. Regular dues will apply and the 30 under 30 program can be used for the development process. While the program was launched with the provision that members of this new group must not have been an Optimist member for the 12-month period prior to the new Club's formation, the New Club Building Committee believes that is too long. It supports a period of four months before a former Optimist would become eligible for this new program.

The Committee encourages the Board to consider making this adjustment to the program.

Motion adopted: Creswell/Paquette

That the OI Board of Directors modify the "Club Within a Club" Initiative to allow former members of Optimist International to be a part of the new group after four months have elapsed since membership ceased. Budget Impact: None

Noon Optimist Club of Centerville's Avenue of Flags

The Noon Optimist Club of Centerville, Ohio, shares their optimism and patriotic spirit in the community with its Avenue of Flags fundraiser. Club Members and other volunteers place American flags in front of 1500+ Centerville homes on five national holidays. Local residents subscribe for the service and the program raises significant amounts allowing the Club to fund its scholarships, community service projects and other youth-oriented activities.

With 100 plus volunteers, the Club has sponsored the Avenue of Flags program in the Centerville – Washington Township, Ohio community for the past 12 years. Teams of Club members and volunteers place flags on 10-foot flagpoles in front of homes and businesses of subscribers on the five national holidays of Memorial Day, Flag Day, Independence Day, Labor Day and Veteran's Day. Subscribers pay \$50 per year for the service and are generous in supporting the Club's efforts in bringing out the best in area youth. The profitable fundraiser has grown from 30 flags to 1550 flags and the Club has even recruited new Members through the program. Teams of Club Members and local volunteers devote approximately 15 hours per year in the setup and removal of flags.

After the initial Club expenses for flags, flagpoles and other supplies, the return on investment for succeeding years is significant. Working together with eight other area Optimist Clubs, program leaders are able to order flag supplies in large quantities which results in a significant cost saving. This fundraising program can work for Optimist Clubs of any size. It is a great way to bond with fellow Members, connect with area residents & families, and to promote all the wonderful ways your Club impacts youth in its community.



Christmas Sharing Program: Each holiday season (since 1984) Optimist members have provided some local families with groceries for a good holiday meal. The Northridge School System provides us with names of families who are particularly needy due to economic circumstances. Club members and other volunteers meet on a particular Saturday in December to buy groceries and deliver them to the families. In 2013, with a budget of \$4500 from donations and with additional support from Cargill and the Needmore Rd. Kroger store, we were able to serve 30 families.

The Denny Mantel Christmas Sharing Fund: Beginning with 2014, the program is being named in honor of Optimist member Denny Mantel who chaired the event for the past 30 years. Each year he spent countless hours organizing and leading the program, and inspiring members with his dedication. Denny passed away in February of 2014, and club members have established a separate fund in his memory to make sure that we can continue the program.


