NEW CLUB BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

The report of the New Club Building Committee was presented to the Board of Directors by Jim Boyd for Committee Chair Jim Oliver

Club Within A Club

Rationale:

The Committee is endorsing an initiative to promote the development of a "Club Within a Club" modeled after the successful young professional's club that is a part of the Lake Lotawanna Optimist Club in the West Missouri District.

Many long standing Clubs have difficulty in attracting younger members. Work force changes have made it difficult for some potential members to attend traditional breakfast or lunch style Club meetings. Social and cultural changes, episodic volunteering and mission/project driven focus presents new opportunities that may be addressed in creative meeting and operational style. The **Social Club or Club Within a Club** would meet once or twice a month in a more social setting in early evenings, with a focus on networking and social gathering. The young professionals group provides a traditional Club with an increased volunteer work force to tackle more complex project. It also will provide a platform for younger professionals to join an Optimist Club for their goals of networking, social activity with the availability of volunteering for activities of interest and impact in the Community.

New Club Building credit would be given to any existing Optimist Club that adds 15 members for the Club Within a Club. Two Builders of Excellence designations would also be granted. The Secretary-Treasurer of the host Club must submit a roster of at least 15 members for the group to be recognized and it is recommended the new group have representation on the existing Club's Board. Regular dues will apply and the 30 under 30 program can be used for the development process. While the program was launched with the provision that members of this new group must not have been an Optimist member for the 12-month period prior to the new Club's formation, the New Club Building Committee believes that is too long. It supports a period of four months before a former Optimist would become eligible for this new program.

The Committee encourages the Board to consider making this adjustment to the program.

Motion adopted: Creswell/Paquette

That the OI Board of Directors modify the "Club Within a Club" Initiative to allow former members of Optimist International to be a part of the new group after four months have elapsed since membership ceased. Budget Impact: None

Ohio District Scholarship Fund

To All Ohio District Optimist Members:

Several times I have been asked, "Why do I continue to ask for donations to the Ohio District Scholarship Fund, when there is so much scholarship money shown in the budget?"

There are many past winners who have not yet claimed the District Scholarship supplements. These past winners have until they reach the age of 25 to enroll in a continuing education program and claim this money. This is the restricted money shown in the budget.

The Ohio District has pledged to supplement the Optimist International Foundation Scholarships for the Oratorical, Essay and CCDHH contests, with an additional \$1000 for each winner and \$100 for each District Oratorical and CCDHH runner-ups each year.

This means that we must raise \$4,600 each year in order to meet this commitment.

Thank you for participating in the 2016-2017 Ohio District Essay Contests, sponsored by Optimist International.

There were 26 Essays from the optimist clubs in the Ohio District that were judged. Overall, there were over 300 students who wrote on Essay on this year's topic: "Chasing Optimism in the Face of Challenges".

The winning Essay was announced at the May Conference, May 6th, 2017. The winner was Emily Sreenan, sponsored by the Lima Shawnee Optimist Club.

As a reminder, the District winner receives a \$2500.00 scholarship from Optimist International Foundation and \$1000.00 scholarship from the Ohio District Scholarship Fund. The winner has until the age of 25 to claim these scholarships to be used for continuing their education. The same amount of scholarships are given to the District's winning CCDHH (Communication Contest for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing) and one male and one female winners for the District's Oratorical Contest.

As a first time District Essay Chair, I thoroughly enjoyed it. I met new optimists from the clubs, learned how clubs announce their winners and also I believe I know the rules by heart since I explained it many times to students who found out about the contest thru the Optimist International website. Thank you Governor Cherie Gentry for giving me this opportunity to chair a great contest.

Yours in the Spirit of Optimism, Sharon M. O'Neil, Ohio District Essay Chair **Rhett Fogt,** a Senior at Jackson Center, recently won the Great Ohio District Optimist District's Communications Contest for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing. The theme of this year's contest was;

"What the World Gains from Optimism."

Rhett Fogt will receive a \$3,500 scholarship for the honor.

"Through spoken word Fogt did a wonderful job of presenting his thoughts about the questions posed to him," District CCDHH Chair Heather Kuth said. "We have no doubt that Rhett has a bright future ahead of him!"

The Great Ohio District has been actively participating in the Communications Contest for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing for past three years. The contest is open to students who have a hearing loss of 40 decibels or more, and students can sign or speak their presentation, or communicate through a combination of the two.

Oratorical Contest Announces Winners

Seven young people spoke in front of a packed audience of Optimists, family, and friends at the District Oratorical Contest on Saturday, May 6. Speaking on the topic "What the World Gains from Optimism," four girls and three boys delivered well-written and memorized speeches. The youngest speaker, Benjamin Blaumeiser, a 7th grader sponsored by the Dor-Wood Optimist Club in Kettering, came out on top with his presentation and the judges said they were impressed with his delivery, poise, projection, and speech organization. Blaumeiser travels to St. Louis in June as the Great Ohio District's representative in the Middle America Region. Best of luck to him!

Anna Schaeffer, a high school senior sponsored by the Strongsville Optimist Club won the girls contest and came in second place overall. She spoke eloquently about her experiences meeting one of the Lost Boys of Sudan and how struck she was by his optimist despite his desperate circumstances. Anna will study international relations at the University of Texas-Dallas in the fall. Both Blaumeiser and Schaeffer earned \$3,500 scholarships, and it was clear that those in attendance came away inspired by this next generation.

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Junior World of Golf

Registration Is Still Open For 2017 Ohio North Optimist Junior Golf Tournament on June 12

The Ohio North Optimist International Junior Golf Championships being held at Canton's Tam O'Shanter Golf Course on Monday, June 12, 2017 is still open for registration. We would GREATLY appreciate it if you would pass this information to all your junior golfers.

The following age/gender divisions will be offered at Tam O'Shanter: BOYS 10-11, 12-13, 14-15, 16-18 and GIRLS 10-12, 13-14, 15-18. The golfer's age determines the division where they play: on July 22, 2017 (for Boys 10-13 and Girls 10-12), July 27, 2017 (for Boys 14-15 and Girls 13-14) and August 2, 2017 (for Boys 16-18 and Girls 15-18).

The 18-hole tournament offers a chance for junior golfers to qualify for "The Optimist" being played at the PGA National Resort & Spa in Palm Beach Gardens, FL for the 21st consecutive year. Winners of each age/gender group, who are Ohio residents, will have their registration paid for at the tournament in Florida. Other qualifiers for this tournament will be responsible for their own expenses.

At "The Optimist" the age/gender competition schedule is as follows:

July 18-23, 2017: Boys 10-11 and 12-13 & Girls 10-12 July 23-28, 2017: Boys 14-15 & Girls 13-14 July 28-August 2, 2017: Boys 16-18 & Girls 15-18

We recommend that all junior golfers register on line at our website: http://golf.optimist.org/oh This website will also be the place to go to download the entry and medical forms, get tee times, tournament results and obtain any other information about Optimist.org/oh. The deadline for registration for the Ohio North Championship Tournament is June 6, 2017.

Remember if you don't register on-line you will need to mail in both the entry and medical forms with your \$80.00 entry check, made out to *OIJGC*. If you register on-line you just need to mail the medical form and check to:


