

Ohio District Scholarship Fund

To All Ohio District Optimist Members:

Several times I have been asked, "Why do I continue to ask for donations to the Ohio District Scholarship Fund, when there is so much scholarship money shown in the budget?"

There are many past winners who have not yet claimed the District Scholarship supplements. These past winners have until they reach the age of 25 to enroll in a continuing education program and claim this money. This is the restricted money shown in the budget.

The Ohio District has pledged to supplement the Optimist International Foundation Scholarships for the Oratorical, Essay and CCDHH contests, with an additional \$1000 for each winner and \$100 for each District Oratorical and CCDHH runner-ups each year.

This means that we must raise \$4,600 each year in order to meet this commitment.

Optimist International Essay Contest

Topic for the 2016-17 School Year is:

"Chasing Optimism in the Face of Challenges"

The Essay Contest is sponsored by Optimist International to give young people the opportunity to write about their own opinions regarding the world in which they live. The approach can encompass a young person's personal experience, the experience of their country or a more historical perspective. In additional to developing skills for written expression, participants also have the opportunity to win a college scholarship!

The guidelines require that contestants be under the age of 18 as of October 1, 2016 and attending school in the United States, Canada, or the Caribbean. Club winners advance to the District contest to compete for a \$2,500 college scholarship. The District-level scholarships are funded by the Optimist International Foundations. The Ohio District of Optimist International also awards a \$1,000 college scholarship. The winner has until the age of 25 to claim their scholarships.

The contest is designed to develop writing and critical thinking skills. One scholarship of \$2,500 per District is awarded by Optimist International each year. Plus the Ohio District of Optimist International also awards a \$1,000.00 scholarship.



Fairfield Optimist Club celebrates 60 years

FAIRFIELD — The Fairfield Optimist Club might be one of the city's best-kept secrets.

The club of about 90 members supports various aspects of the city, but quietly, said Fairfield Mayor Steve Miller, who is also a member.

"The Optimist Club does an awful lot for this community," he said. "The Optimist Club knows what they're doing and the recipients know what they're doing, and that's what's important. It's always been that way."

And to celebrate the club's 60 years of service to the city, Miller proclaimed Tuesday, Sept. 13, as "Optimist Club of Fairfield, Ohio 60th Anniversary Day" in the city and gave club president Jeff Herold a one-of-a-kind key to the city.

"We wanted to do something different, something special, and that's exactly what we came up with tonight," said Miller.

Instead of a standard key to the city, a special plaque was signed by all members of city council.

Herold said they are "just a group of guys that like to

give back."

"We appreciate being a small part of what makes this city great," he said. "We like to help the youth of the community, we enjoy it and we feel it's a good thing to do and we do it."

The Optimist Club is involved in youth in the community, following its motto "Friend of Youth." The club helped to introduce soccer in the 1970s, and this past April co-sponsored the 31st annual MASC tournament in which 500 teams from eight states and Canada participated.

The club also sponsors youth baseball and soccer teams, awards three college scholarships to area seniors, sponsors events and organizations supporting the youth, such as fishing derbies, after

proms for Fairfield and Badin high schools, Joe Nuxhall Miracle League Fields, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, One Way Farm. The club also adopts needy children at Christmas and arranges a personal delivery from Santa.

Being around for 60 years "means we're doing something right," and the club has some "luck" on its side, said Herold.

"If feels great to carry on that tradition," he said.

The Optimist Club is a men's club and its mission is to "bring out the best in kids" by conducting positive service projects. The club works with the Paragon Optimist Club, which is a women's club that was founded in 2004.


