

Introductions: Members in attendance were introduced.

Status of the District: Governor Myron reported that Ohio is ranked at 18 out of 49 districts. Membership is at -5. Ohio is #2 in the Great Lakes Region. Tiffin has put in a request for disbandment.

Chuck Davis appointed Lt. Governor for Zone 7.

Secretary's reports: The Minutes for the 4th quarter were sent 30 days prior to the meeting with the call. Secretary Barb moved for their approval.

Treasurers reports and budget for 2019-2020 Treasurer Jeff Umbreit submitted the financials and budget and moved for their approval. Terry Schalnat of Zone 12 seconded the motion. Motion carried.

PROPOSED DISTRICT POLICY AMENDMENT

The following proposed change to District Policies was received by the District Secretary, Barbara Layne, on January 9, 2020, from Jeff Umbreit, District Treasurer 2019-2020.

This proposed change in the District Policy will be voted on at the 2nd Quarter 2020 Conference (February 15, 2020) to become effective April 1, 2020.

The section in question is Article 1 Section 5 "District Finances", Item B "District Dues"

The District Treasurer requests an amendment to the district policy to allow the use of Optimist International's billing services to include quarterly district dues with Optimist International quarterly Club invoices. Currently, 50% of all OI Districts use OI's billing services to bill their district's dues. Benefits of this amendment are:

☐ Allows each club to pay their OI club dues and district dues with one payment

Payment can be made online as an ACH debit or credit card. OI will absorb any credit card transaction fees.

☐ Allows Ohio District Officers to monitor outstanding district dues on Ol's online dashboard

 \square Decreases the processing time of both the invoices and payments by the Ohio District Treasurer

The District's quarterly cost paid to Optimist International for their billing service is \$20 per quarterly invoice run plus \$0.15 per invoice. With the current club count of 65, the quarterly cost would be \$29.75 or \$119 annually.

Policy As Currently Written

Ohio District dues statements are mailed and/or emailed to each club bi-annually or quarterly per administrative year, at the discretion of the District Secretary and Treasurer. The billings are based on all members on the club's roster as follows:

October is based on September 30th, January is based on December 31st, April is based on March 31st and July is based on June 30th,

If additional billings are required to a club, the first shall be sent thirty (30) days after the original billing to the President of the club. If the second billing is not paid, an additional billing shall be sent sixty (60) days after the original billing to the President of that club. The sixty-day bill shall also have a 1.5% service charge on the balance due to the Ohio District.

Any club more than 60 days in arrears for any indebtedness to the Ohio District or Optimist International shall
 be considered "not in good standing" and shall forfeit all rights and privileges of membership during the period
 of indebtedness.

If a club is over 90 days past due, the club is subject to charter revocation.

Proposed Amendment Policy

Ohio District dues invoices are mailed and /or emailed to each club, quarterly per administrative year by Optimist International. The District Dues will be added to the Optimists International Club Dues Invoice using membership counts from September 30, December 31, March 31 and June 30 with invoice dates of October 1, January 1, April 1 and July 1, respectively. Clubs will remit District Dues along with their Club Dues to Optimist International. On a weekly basis, District Dues collected by Optimist International will be electronically transferred to the Ohio District's bank account. A detailed report of the district dues payments comprised in the electronic transfer will be emailed to the District Secretary/Treasurer on the date the funds are transferred. If a club has not made payment within 30 days, a copy of the initial Optimist International invoice shall be sent thirty (30) days after the original billing to the President of the club by the Ohio District Treasurer. If this second billing is not paid, an additional billing shall be sent sixty (60) days after the original billing to the President of that club by the Ohio District Treasurer and will include a 1.5% service charge on the balance due to the Ohio District.

Any club more than 60 days in arrears for any indebtedness to the Ohio District or Optimist International shall be considered "not in good standing" and shall forfeit all rights and privileges of membership during the period of indebtedness.

If a club is over 90 days past due, the club is subject to charter revocation.
