Oratorical Contest 2021

"Healing the World with Optimism"



The District finals will be held at the 3rd quarter District conference on <u>Saturday, May 1, 2021</u>, at the Embassy Suites here in Dublin (World Competition is slated for Saint Louis July 15-17, 2021).

OI awards \$2,500 to the winner with the District adding \$1,000 for a total of \$3,500. Send place from OI receives \$1,500 and the District adds \$500 for a total of \$2,000, and third place receives \$1,000 from OI, \$500 from the District, for a total \$1,500. These additional monies from the District come from the Bill O'Neil Memorial Scholarship fund.

The deadlines for the various contest levels are:

Club Contests: Conducted by March 3, 2021.

Zone Contests: Conducted by March 24, 2021.

Regional Contests: Conducted by April 17, 2021.



- The Contestant's Application Form for the 2020-2021 Contest
- The Zone/District Regional/District Entry Form which must include the number of contestants that participated in each level of the contest AND the appropriate signatures, including the contestants.'
- The Optimist Regional Information Form from the Regions which will be held in April.
- A Copy of the contestant's birth certificate or passport. No other age verification documents will be accepted.
- A copy of the contestant's Club Contest Evaluation which can be found in the Club Planning Guide.
- A printed copy of the speech.

<u>Optimist International Launches Childhood Health and Wellness Matching Grant Program</u>

Is your club looking for new ways to positively impact the lives of children in your community?

If so, check out the new Childhood Health and Wellness (CHW) Program at the following link on the OI website. https://oifoundation.org/downloads/Childhood Health Wellness Grant Application Fillable.pdf

The Childhood Health and Wellness Program is an extension of the Childhood Cancer campaign developed "in response to requests from Optimist Clubs recognizing the broad range of childhood health-related issues."

This matching grant program will pay 50% of the projects cost, ranging from \$250 - \$1000 in four categories: Healthy Lifestyles (e.g. Physical Fitness, Nutrition), Chronic Diseases (e.g. Childhood Cancer, Juvenile Diabetes, MS, Ronald McDonald House) Mental Health (e.g. Depression, Abuse, Bullying), Disabilities – Physical, Intellectual & Developmental (e.g. Autism, Special Olympics)

To be considered your club must:

- 1. Identify a new CHW project.
- 2. Approve project funding.
- 3. Complete the three-page application.
- 4. Submit the signed application by one of the deadlines below to:

No NURSING HOME FOR ME!!!!

I'll be checking into a MARRIOTT!

With the average cost for nursing home care being \$275.00 per day, there is a better way when we get old and too feeble. I've already checked on reservations at The FAIRFIELD.

For a combined long term stay discount and senior discount, it's \$79.00 per night for up to two persons(spouse) Breakfast is included, and some have happy hours In the afternoon. That leaves \$196.00 a day for lunch and dinner in any restaurant we want, or room service, laundry, Gratuities and special TV movies. Plus, they provide a spa, swimming pool, a workout room, a lounge and washer dryer, etc.

Most have free toothpaste and razors, and all have free shampoo and soap. \$10 worth of tips a day you'll have the entire staff scrambling to help you. They treat you like a customer, not a patient.

There's a city bus stop out front, and seniors ride free. The handicap bus will also pick you up (if you fake a decent limp). To meet other nice people, call a church bus on Sundays. For a change of scenery, take the airport shuttle bus and eat at one of the nice restaurants there. While you're at the airport, fly somewhere. Otherwise, the cash keeps building up.

It takes months to get into decent nursing homes. Marriott will take your reservation today. And you're not stuck in one place forever -- you can move from Marriott to Marriott, or even from city to city.

Want to see Hawaii? They have COURTYARD there too.

TV broken? Light bulbs need changing? Need a mattress replaced? No problem.. They fix everything, and apologize for the inconvenience.

The Mariott has a night security person and daily room service. The maid checks to see if you are ok. If not, they'll call an ambulance . . . Or the undertaker.

If you fall and break a hip, Medicare will pay for the hip, and Marriott will upgrade you to a suite for the rest of your life.

And no worries about visits from family. They will always be glad to find you, and probably check in for a few days a mini vacation. The grand-kids can use the pool.

What more could I ask for? So, when I reach that golden age, I'll face it with a grin.
